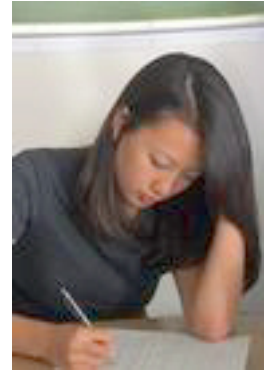

## Program Objective

On successfully completing our High School Bridging Program, students should:

- Be much better prepared and confident to enter the Canadian High Schools
- Be able to progress through high school with less academic and social challenges
- Have an understanding of the high school system and interact with teachers and fellow students efficiently
- Develop a working knowledge of the English language necessary for high school work in Canada
- Demonstrate a general understanding of specific high school subjects – Mathematics, Science, English, and Social Studies



## Who Can Take the High School Bridging Program?

- International students intending to enroll in a Canadian public secondary school
- International students intending to enroll in a Canadian private high school
- International students who want to have a head start in Canadian public or private high schools
- Students who may face language and cultural barriers on enrolling in the Canadian public or private high school
- Students who need strong preparatory background to be able to work progressively in the Canadian public or private school

## Certification on Completion

Each student will be awarded a Metropolitan Community College's certificate of completion and transcripts of marks on completing our HSB program. These documents can facilitate entry into High Schools, and eliminate often rigorous and sometimes time-consuming entry assessments almost always conducted by high schools authorities for those students who lack HSB qualifications.

## HSB Duration and Class Format

Subjects: Maths, English, Science and Social Studies  
Duration: 5 months  
Class Time: All subjects taught from 9:00a.m. – 5:00p.m. (Full-time, Monday to Friday)  
Admission: There are no pre-requisites for admission into the program.  
Program Start Date: There are two start dates. The first is in March, and the second in August each year.  
Instructional Format: Instructor-led lectures, group activity, one-to-one sessions.

## HSB Program Features

The High School Bridging program features four key Canadian high school subjects, namely a) English, b) Maths, c) Science, and finally d) Social Studies.

### a) English Language (taught in the morning - a.m.)

- Teach English Language skills as an important component of Bridging Program, focusing on developing students' abilities in listening, speaking, reading and writing.

All students will enter the program on the basis of assessment done according to Canadian Language Benchmarks. They may enter the Literacy level, Level 1, Level 2 or Level 3 and progress right through to Intermediate and Advanced levels of English Proficiency in order to achieve a smooth transition easy to enter the Elementary or Secondary schools.

- Teach Grammar, Vocabulary and Composition through various themes and topics.

We will help the students to learn the rules and use of grammar through a carefully sequenced progression of grammatical exercises. Vocabulary and composition skills will be taught to enhance the need of simple and complex readings and to encourage the composition of paragraphs, stories and essays.

- Upgrade students' skills to the next level of English learning while following the pathway to the uppermost level of proficiency.

Students will be evaluated frequently to check their level of progression and to help them reach their next step in the pathway of Bridging Program.

- Teach conversational skills through correct use of pronunciation, and accent.

The aim is to help students learn to speak fluently and accurately through contextually rich dialogues. The students will be actively engaged in meaningful conversational exchanges within carefully structured grammatical frameworks. The end result will be the correct pronunciation of English speech and clearly understood accent.

- Teach idioms, slangs and most commonly used proverbs to help students understand native Canadians better.

**b) Maths** (taught in the morning - a.m.)

The maths class is based on the Canadian High School maths curriculum, and covers a range of maths applications and principles at the secondary school level.

**c) Science** (taught in the afternoon - p.m.)

Emphasis is on general science subjects. As in all our HSB subjects, the science lesson draws on the Canadian High School curriculum. Its focus is on understanding a number of high school science subjects in general terms. Although specific science subjects will be examined, much of the examination and quizzes will be based on assessing the general understanding of high school science subjects.

**d) Social Studies** (taught in the afternoon - p.m.)

The teaching of social studies is based, as well, on the Canadian High School curriculum. Topical issues to be covered include: a) social issues, b) cultural issues, c) legal issues d) political issues, e) economic issues, f) environmental issues, and finally g) skills and processes.

**Advantages of HSB Program**

- Program participants will gain prior exposure to the Canadian public high school environment before actually facing the challenges of their high school classroom work. This will be done through field trips to collaborating public high schools.
- Participants will improve their English language skills in listening, reading, grammar and comprehension
- Participants will enhance their knowledge of maths, science, English and social studies in the context of the Canadian public high school.

## **Sport, Culture, Outdoor Programs and Excursions**

This is an integral part of Metropolitan Community College's English programs. Instructors, staff and students are able to take advantage of our campus downtown locations by visiting the city's many attractions to enhance English learning.

### **Activities that aim to improve English include:**

**Social English:** Every day instructors join their Speaking and Listening class students for a half-hour break at a local coffee shop. This allows students to use the language learned in class in a casual, natural setting.

**Clubs:** Students can join after-class clubs. Drama and Canadian Culture are just two examples of clubs.

**Field Trips:** General English classes visit shops, restaurants and local attractions to practice classroom language in real situations, while English for academic purposes classes venture out to libraries and universities for research and information-gathering tasks. The High School Bridging program students also visit secondary schools for familiarization tours.

### **Computer Assisted Learning**

At Metropolitan Community College, Computer Assisted Learning is a core part of the curriculum. Classes are scheduled for at least one session a week in the computer lab.

Instructors plan and facilitate interactive lessons using the Internet, language programs and a variety of computer applications to enhance students' speaking, listening, reading, writing and study skills. Business and English for Academic

Purposes classes participate in additional computer assisted learning sessions to master practical applications such as PowerPoint or Excel.



## **ESL General**

Metropolitan Community College's program is designed to develop students' English communication abilities in a Canadian immersion environment. The General English course caters to all levels from beginner to advanced.

The full-time program consists of Speaking and Listening (Conversation) in the mornings and Reading and Writing (Oral Grammar) in the afternoons.

Student/instructor interviews are held regularly, and students receive monthly written evaluations. At the successful completion of their course, students receive a Metropolitan Community College Certificate of Completion.

The focus of the Speaking and Listening class is on improving fluency in spoken English and developing confidence in the use of English. It is offered at all levels, from beginner to advanced. The theme-based curriculum focuses on speaking and listening skills, pronunciation and vocabulary development.

- **Speaking:** Speak in a variety of situations to develop confidence, fluency and accuracy. Students work in pairs, groups and together as a class.
- **Listening:** Follow and better understand information from conversations, stories, discussions and more.
- **Pronunciation:** Work to improve production of specific English sounds. Improve intonation and stress for spoken English.
- **Vocabulary:** Learn vocabulary in context as related to weekly themes. Increase working vocabulary of “real” English for a variety of situations.

### **Reading And Writing (Oral Grammar) (P.M.)**

Levels: Beginner to advanced

Duration: 1-12 months

Maximum class size: 15

This course focuses on the review and practice of English grammar in daily situations. Classes are active, using student-centred tasks to improve English. The program is designed to help students improve accuracy in spoken English, increase knowledge of English grammar and develop confidence in the use of English. The course includes written homework assignments.

- **Reading:** Read a variety of texts based on weekly themes. Use specific techniques to increase reading speed and comprehension. Engage in conversations and group discussions based on homework readings.
- **Writing:** Express ideas in written English. Learn to use a variety of structures to enhance English expression.
- **Oral Grammar:** Learn to speak and write with increased accuracy. Practice different structures to communicate more effectively.

### **English for Academic Purposes**

This program is designed to help students develop independent learning skills, analytical and critical thinking skills, academic communication skills, confidence in using English and strategies for successful transition to college or university. This is also developed into an integrated ESL, and is offered with Metropolitan Community College's diploma programs in all disciplines - Dental Assisting, Para-legal, Business, Accounting, Counselling, Thanatology, Medical Laboratory Assisting, etc. Fees shown in the fee guide are only for the ESL component, and exclude main stream diploma costs. For the actual main stream diploma fee, please contact the Admissions Office.

Here, students are introduced to academic skills, and are provided with the foundation for the second level. The emphasis is on continued improvement of general English skills while building appropriate vocabulary and study skills for more independent learning. Students are introduced to analytical and critical thinking skills, and learn techniques for more effective group work and communication.

The course content includes:

### **Speaking**

- Communicate more effectively in pairs and groups
- Develop confidence, fluency, and accuracy

### **Listening**

- Listen for main ideas and details
- Use note-taking strategies

### **Reading**

- Develop prediction, skimming and scanning techniques
- Use texts as a basis for pair and group discussions

### **Writing**

- Focus on paragraphs and short essays
- Develop self-correction and editing skills

### **Study Skills**

- Focus on becoming a more independent learner
- Develop effective time-management strategies
- Participate in Computer Assisted Language Learning sessions
- Prepare assignments using word-processing applications



## **English for Academic Purposes 2<sup>nd</sup> Level (Full-time)**

Level: Advanced

Duration: 3 months

Maximum class size: 15

The second level provides students with the study skills and English language level required for successful study at either the undergraduate or post-graduate level. The course is also suitable for students who want an intensive, full-time, integrated program, which challenges them at the academic level.

The course content includes:

### **Speaking**

- Present, justify, and discuss opinions on different topics
- Give individual and group presentations

### **Listening**

- Follow and understand information from discussions, presentations, and short lectures
- Use note-taking skills

### **Reading**

- Read a variety of texts
- Use prediction, skimming and scanning techniques

### Special 6-month EAP Program

The 6-month English for Academic Purposes program provides students with a solid combination of English and academic skills. The course begins with the basics of academic English, and continues on to build students' skills in speaking, listening, reading and writing in academic contexts. Students learn to use the skills taught in class in a variety of practical applications.

### Business English (Full-time)

Levels: Lower intermediate to advanced

Duration: 1-6 months

Maximum class size: 15

The Business English program is designed for students who wish to improve their ability to learn business English in a professional manner, increase knowledge of business vocabulary in both formal and informal situations, and develop confidence in speaking, listening, reading, writing and giving presentations in English. Students are given monthly evaluations, and upon successful completion of the course, receive both Metropolitan Community College certificate and final assessment of their English language abilities.

The course includes:

- Terminology of commerce, international trade, finance, and service industries
- Writing resumes, letters, faxes, and memos
- Producing graphs, charts, and tables
- Reading business journals, newspapers, documents, and reports
- Giving formal business presentations

## Some examples of customized programs include:

### a) Short Study Tours (Groups)

Metropolitan Community College organizes English programs for company, school, and tour groups of ten or more. Short study tours are created to meet the individual needs and requests of each group. Students also have the opportunity to stay with Canadian homestay families and experience typical Canadian life.

### b) Teacher Training Program (Groups)

The Teacher Training Program gives teachers and prospective teachers the opportunity to improve their English skills while receiving instruction on teaching practice and communicative methods. Participants take part in activities and lessons, followed by discussion and analysis of the methodology used. The curriculum is custom-designed to fit the needs of the teacher group.

### c) Professional English (Individuals And Groups)

This intensive program is suitable for individuals or small closed-groups. The curriculum is custom-designed to meet the specific English language and business needs of professionals and executives. The course may include:

- **Development of English skills:** grammar, specialized vocabulary, improving fluency and pronunciation
- **Development of professional skills:** presentations and meetings, conducting business meetings, negotiation skills

The Internship Program gives students the opportunity to use their English skills in a business environment while gaining real-world business work experience. This unique program provides the opportunity for companies and candidates to participate in a cultural and skills exchange where qualified candidates offer their experience and expertise to a local company for the opportunity to learn Canadian corporate culture and business style.



The Internship Program consists of one to four months of full-time English studies at Metropolitan Community College followed by the internship. The English component must comprise a minimum of 50% of the Internship Program, and students are expected to be near-to-proficiency in English to be eligible to participate in the internship component of the program. Prior to entering an internship, students will receive counselling to ensure a successful transition into the Canadian business environment. Note that placements in specific companies or industry cannot be guaranteed.
